I want another shot at this internship opportunity to get my foot further through the door. I had the same internship last year, but I feel like I got little out of it besides a résumé piece. I learned a lot about the environment and the people who make the Capitol run, but I never really took the next step to figure out how that experience could connect to my future. This time, I plan to change that. I want to explore options that could lead to a career while still fulfilling all my intern responsibilities. After my internship last year, I felt more lost than ever and completely unprepared for the real world. That's not the case anymore. I've had time to reflect on what I could have done differently, and now I'm determined to make this second chance count.

I'm clawing back for another opportunity at the desk job I woke up for twice a week, not just to do the same work, but to do it better and with purpose. I want to build on what I learned from last years' experience while also marketing myself in the Capitol, since I'm graduating next fall. I met a lot of people last year, but this time I have real goals and a clearer sense of direction. The only thing hanging over me now is the approaching cloud of adulthood, and I'm ready to face it.
